



6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Eight faculty members of the institution (including two chairpersons) have contributed in designing the curriculum of the UG and PG courses of the University. Choice based credit system (CBCS) syllabus for PG courses in the university have been implemented from the academic year 2016-17. The same for UG courses is scheduled to be implemented from the next academic year 2017-18.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning:

Along with the traditional method of chalk and talk of 'Teaching and Learning', the faculty members have adopted advanced technology of 'Teaching and Learning' through ICT, like PPT, charts, and seminars to enhance the quality of higher education.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation:

- ➤ Before the semisterwise University Exams the students are evaluated by conducting Unit Tests, Seminars, Home Assignments, Group Discussions and Oral Tests etc.
- > Evaluation in the University Exam is being carried by Valuation and Moderation method.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- ➤ 10 faculty members out of 16 have awarded Ph. D. and remaining all faculty members have registered for Ph. D. and their research work is in progress. 3 faculty members have submitted their Ph.D.thesis.
- ➤ 4 faculty members are Ph. D. guides and 12 students are doing their research work under their guidance.
- ➤ 3 scholars have awarded Ph.D. under the supervision of a faculty member in the institution.
- Minor Research Projects of two faculty members have been sanctioned and their work is in progress. The final report of one Minor Research Project has been submitted in

the university.		

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Library is atomized for its better service to the students and staff.
- The library is enriched with textbooks, journals, reference books, magazines etc. as usual.
- ➤ Reading Room is made available to the students as well as staff.
- ➤ Internet Resource Centre along with Wi-Fi service is provided in the library.
- As a part of physical infrastructure / instrumentation, the institution has a huge playground for various sports activities along with Basket-ball court and Gymnasium Centre.

- As per plan and need, Resource persons from outside are invited.

The procedure of recruitment of faculty and staff is carried out as and when required as per the norms laid down by UGC/Govt. of Maharashtra / University. 70% vacancies of faculty are fulfilled. 10 vacancies are fulfilled by appointing temporary faculties on Clock Hour basis. Vacancies in non-teaching staff are above 90% fulfilled.
