## 5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services:

- 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Eight faculty members of the institution (including two chairpersons) have contributed in designing the curriculum of the UG and PG courses of the University. Choice based credit system (CBCS) syllabus for PG courses in the university have been implemented from the academic year 2016-17. The same for UG courses is scheduled to be implemented from the next academic year 2017-18.
